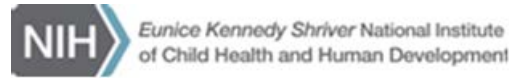


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Individuals with Hypogonadotropic hypogonadism/ Kallmann syndrome wanted

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) Clinical Center seeks adult males and females with hypogonadotropic hypogonadism/ Kallmann syndrome for a research study. Researchers want to learn more about the emotions of people who have disorders that affect puberty and sexual development. Participation includes one phone call and completing online questionnaires. There are no study visits. Compensation will be provided.

Study details:

- You will have one phone call with our study team and answer questions about your medical history and family health history.
- You will complete online questionnaires about anxiety, depression, satisfaction in social roles, and health. It should take you less than an hour to complete the questionnaires.

You may be eligible if:

- You are 18 or older
- You have been diagnosed with Kallmann syndrome, Hypogonadotropic hypogonadism, or GnRH deficiency
- You have a history of abnormal puberty development
- You are on the full adult dose of hormone replacement therapy and have been for at least 3 months
